3. Each exhibitor will receive an award.
4. Parents must exercise sound judgment in selecting the animal their youngster will exhibit.
5. All exhibitors **MUST** wear closed-toed shoes.
6. Exhibitors and animals may be removed if, in the opinion of the livestock committee, they present danger to other exhibitors.
7. Exhibitors must be registered prior to the show.
8. Goats must have horns tipped (squared off ½ inch or larger in diameter)
9. KUIP tag is Required.

1. Open to all youth nine (9) years old or older as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year who are residents of Breckinridge Co., registered Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club members or members of the Breckinridge County FFA and who have attended a Breckinridge County school during the year of showing, includes the fair following the member's high school graduation.

October 2023 AMENDMENT: \*\*A non-Breckinridge County resident that has attended a Breckinridge County School in person and completed a minimum of two (2) consecutive years and is enrolled in the Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club (and completes the required six (6) hours), or a Breckinridge County FFA member are eligible to show through completion of their senior year of high school. EXAMPLE 1<sup>st</sup> year enrolled in Breckinridge County School, 2<sup>nd</sup> year enrolled in Breckinridge County School and a member of the Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club OR Breckinridge County FFA qualifies a youth to show and sell the 2<sup>nd</sup> year.

\*If a non-resident at any point returned to their home county or other school system, they forfeit their eligibility permanently.

2. ALL Exhibitors must complete the required six (6) hours of educational meetings through the 4-H Livestock Club or an active member of the Breckinridge County FFA and other assignments as requested.
3. Each youth may exhibit four (4) animals in the show. The exhibitor must show their own animals. If a member has more than one (1) animal in a class, a qualified Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club member, FFA Exhibitor or a qualified sibling will be allowed to show the animal. Limit of one (1) animal per exhibitor in the Breckinridge Youth Premium Livestock Auction.
4. Market steers and market heifers will be broken into classes by weights, to be set after the weigh-in. All market heifers must be open. Heifers exhibited in Breeding Heifer Show may not be shown in the Market-Steer/Market-Heifer Show. Market animals will be weighed-in Wednesday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, 8:30-10 a.m. (CT)  
**The minimum weight requirement is 800 lbs. with a five (5) lbs. variance for scales.** No re-weighs will be allowed.  
Grand and Reserve Champions and all animals that are in the sale must remain at the fairgrounds until after the Youth Premium Livestock Auction. All exhibitors must remove their animals from the fairgrounds following the Youth Premium Livestock Auction on Thursday, June 20<sup>th</sup> by 10 p.m (CT).
5. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky. In addition, all entries must have an official health certificate according to Kentucky State regulations. Health certificates will be checked at weigh in.
6. Animals MUST have been identified with a KUIP tag and entered in the database according to KY State Fair KUIP guidelines. Animals MUST be owned and under continual care of the exhibitor by KUIP tagging date. Animals shall be available for inspection within Breckinridge County at any time after the tagging.
7. Exhibitors shall groom and fit their own animals with little or no assistance from adults.
8. Any animal the show committee considers a hazard due to health or physically dangerous to other animals, exhibitors, spectators, etc. will be removed from the show and possibly fairgrounds and will be ineligible for class placement and premiums. All entries must be halter broken. Use of tail heads or switches will be prohibited.
9. Each exhibitor will receive a ribbon. Grand & Reserve Champions will receive an award.
10. A showmanship class will be held at the beginning of the beef show. Rosette will be given for each age division winner. An award will be given to the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion of each species.

Open to all youth nine (9) years old or older as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year who are residents of Breckinridge County, registered Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club members or members of the Breckinridge County FFA and who have attended a Breckinridge County school during the year of showing, includes the fair following the member's high school graduation.

October 2023 AMENDMENT: \*\*A non-Breckinridge County resident that has attended a Breckinridge County School in person and completed a minimum of two (2) consecutive years and is enrolled in the Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club (and completes the required six (6) hours), or a Breckinridge County FFA member are eligible to show through completion of their senior year of high school. EXAMPLE 1<sup>st</sup> year enrolled in Breckinridge County School, 2<sup>nd</sup> year enrolled in Breckinridge County School and a member of the Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club OR Breckinridge County FFA qualifies a youth to show and sell the 2<sup>nd</sup> year.

3. Each youth may exhibit no more than two (2) animals in the same class. The exhibitor must show their own animals. If a member has more than one (1) animal in a class, a qualified Breckinridge County 4-H Livestock Club member, FFA Exhibitor or qualified sibling will be allowed to show the animal.
4. Classes of Heifers will be divided by individual breed, ONLY if there are more than 5 animals in each breed. Heifers shown in the Market Steer/Market Heifer Show cannot be exhibited in the Breeding Heifer Show. No animal will be allowed to be shown more than once, except for Championship Drive or Showmanship. Age classification will be from **September 1, 2021 to April 30, 2023**. Animals shown in the Youth Breeding Heifer Show ARE NOT eligible for the Youth Premium Livestock Auction. DOB of heifers will be confirmed prior to show,
5. Entries will be taken on Wednesday June 19<sup>th</sup> between 8:30-10 a.m. CT. Exhibitors may remove their animals from the fairgrounds following the youth Breeding Heifer Show except Grand and Reserve Champions. Grand and Reserve Champions must remain at the fairgrounds until after the Youth Premium Livestock Auction. All animals must be removed from the fairgrounds no later than Thursday, June 20<sup>th</sup> by 10 p.m. (CT).
6. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky. All animals are to be shown in normal breeding condition. In addition, all entries must have an official health certificate according to Kentucky State regulations. Health certificates will be checked at weigh in.
6. Animals shall be owned and under continual care of the exhibitor by June 1. All animals must conform to the KY State Fair Rules for nomination of eligibility to show at the Breckinridge County Fair Livestock Heifer Show.
7. Exhibitors shall groom and fit their own animals with little or no assistance from adults.
8. Any animal the show committee considers a hazard due to health or physical to other animals, exhibitors, spectators, etc. will be removed from the show and possibly fairgrounds and will be ineligible for class placement and premiums. All entries must be halter broken. Use of tail heads or switches will be prohibited.
9. Each exhibitor will receive a ribbon. Grand & Reserve Champions will receive an award.

Grand and Reserve Champions and all animals that are in the sale must remain at the fairgrounds until after the Youth Premium Livestock Auction. All exhibitors must remove their animals from the fairgrounds following the Youth Premium Livestock Auction on Thursday, June 20<sup>th</sup> by 10 p.m. (CT).
5. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky. In addition, all entries must have an official health certificate according to Kentucky State regulations. Health certificates will be checked at weigh in.
6. Animals **MUST** be identified with a KUIP ear tag and must entered in the database by the appropriate deadline. **2024 YOUTH PREMIUM  
LIVESTOCK AUCTION**

**Thursday, July 20th , 6:00 p.m. (CT)**

1. Only animals which have been shown in the Breckinridge County Youth Livestock Shows (excluding novice and Cloverbuds) are eligible for the Youth Premium Livestock Auction.
2. Each exhibitor is allowed to participate with one (1) animal in the Youth Premium Livestock Auction. If an exhibitor should win two (2) or more championships in any species, they may only select one (1) animal to sell in the auction. The other animals (Grand and Reserve Champion) will be exhibited and recognized.
3. All animals must remain at the fairgrounds from weigh-in time until auction time.
4. All animals must be in place promptly at auction time otherwise animals will be disqualified from the auction.
5. Each exhibitor will be responsible for removing their animal from the fairgrounds by 10 p.m. (CT) following the auction on Thursday, June 20<sup>th</sup>.
6. The exhibitor reserves the right to show their animal at the Kentucky State Fair.
7. The base price for the animals will be determined by a stockyard's representative. The actual price an exhibitor receives will be the difference in base price and auction price, less small fee.
8. Auction buyers should make checks payable to the Breckinridge County Youth Premium Livestock Auction. It is requested that buyers sign in upon arrival and bills will be sent after the auction. Settlements will not be made the night of the auction. All settlements must be made within 30 days.
9. The Exhibitor must be present to sell their animal in the Youth Premium Livestock Auction. Exhibitors must be present to sell their animal in the Youth Premium Livestock Auction unless otherwise authorized by the Youth Livestock Advisory committee.
